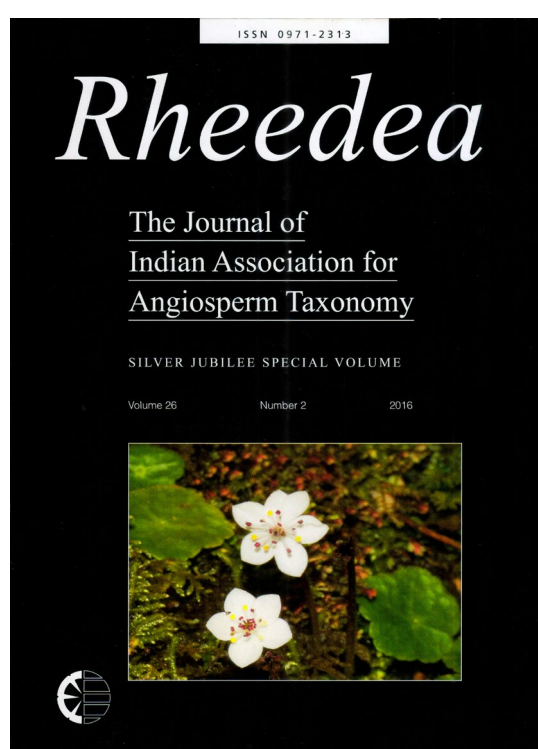

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A report on XXVI Annual Conference of Indian Association for Angiosperm Taxonomy (IAAT) and International Seminar on Conservation and Sustainable Utilization of Biodiversity

The 26th Annual Conference of Indian Association for Angiosperm Taxonomy (IAAT) and International Seminar on "Conservation and Sustainable Utilization of Biodiversity" was organized from 7th to 9th November 2016 at the Department of Botany, Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The inaugural function was presided over by Prof. Devanand B. Shinde, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Prof. D.K. Gaikwad, Head, Department of Botany, Shivaji University welcomed the dignitaries and participants followed by the introduction of dignitaries by Prof. S.S. Kamble. Prof. G.R Naik, Pro Vice-Chancellor, Central University, Karnataka delivered the inaugural address. His address threw light on the significance of biodiversity and role of taxonomists in documentation and conservation of biodiversity. A total of 120 oral and 108 poster presentations were presented in the following thematic areas: 1. Systematics of Flowering Plants, 2. Modern Trends and Techniques in Plant Taxonomy, 3. Biodiversity Assessment and Conservation, 4. Phytogeography, Endemism and Threatened Plants, 5. Ethnobotany and Medicinal Plants and 6. Bioprospecting and Sustainable Utilization. A total of 417 participants from more than 55 Universities and Research Institutes of India including 3 from abroad have participated in the conference, and making it a grand event.

The executive body meeting of IAAT was held at the Department of Botany on 7th November, 2016. As a part of the cultural programme a demonstration

of traditional marshal games of Marata region was performed by the famous Anandrao Thombare Group from Kolhapur, which was appreciated very much by the participants. The General Body meeting of IAAT took place on 8th November 2016 at Rajarshi Shahu Auditorium. A pre-dinner entertainment programme with instrumental music and songs was arranged.
